Standard Breed Class

Amber Link



Mainly white with some brown feathers, the Amberlink has become a favorite, with her beautiful full brown egg color.



Isa Brown

They are exceptional medium-dark brown egg layers. They are a small framed bird that excels in feed-to-egg efficiency. ISA Hens are a rust color with lighter highlights generally in the cape, wings, tail and fluff; roosters will have the reverse coloring. They are an adaptable breed that can tolerate confinement or free range, and a steadfast producer of large to extra-large eggs.

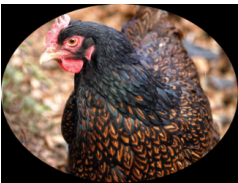
Blue Rock

The Blue Rock results from crossing Barred Rocks and Blue Andalusians leave us with a sex-linked layer breed. These striking birds are monochromatic – hens being largely light gray fading into a charcoal head. Blue Rocks are a very good layer of large brown eggs; they are also quite hardy and cold tolerant.



Buckeye

They're named after the "Buckeye State" of Ohio where this breed originated in 1896. Buckeyes have rich yellow skin, with mahogany feathering and black tail. They adjust to confinement well but prefer to range on grass. A good dual purpose producer of brown eggs well suited for small farmyard and backyard flocks.



Barnevelder

Originating from Holland this is a very cold tolerant breed. They are a gorgeous burnt orange with thick black lacing throughout. They are a medium sized bird laying dark brown eggs. With their calm and easygoing temperament, they are an excellent choice for your backyard.



Cinnamon Queen

Cinnamon Queens are prolific layers and are also hardy and good meat producers. They have a fast body growth rate compared to other hybrid chickens. Their friendly demeanor makes them wonderful birds to keep in your flock.



Dark Brahmas

Unlike other Brahmas, the color pattern of the Dark Brahma depends on the sex of the bird. Roosters are typically black and silver while hens sport a beautiful silver-penciled plumage. Like all Brahmas, Dark Brahmas have feathered shanks and toes. These brown egg layers have a very calm temperament.



Noir Marans

The Noir Maran is a very good layer of rich dark brown eggs ranging from copper to chocolate in color. These hens are largely black with varying amounts of bronze. The roosters are cuckoo. This breed produces a combination of both clean and feather legged chicks.



Olive Egger

Olive Eggers come in virtually any and every color and/or combination of muffs, tufts, and rumps. Olive eggers are f1, Meaning First Generation, and are bred from Black copper Marans and Ameraucanas. These chicks will grow into hens that lay predominantly green eggs ranging in color from sage to olive. There is potential to lay other colors also. Moderate size and egg production – these are truly an ornamental bird.



Partridge Rock

These are a rare variety of the Plymouth Rock family. Their striking color patterns make them one of the best varieties for the exhibitor. Known not only to be a dependable brown egg



layer but also very good setters.

Production Red

By utilizing crosses between New Hampshire's and Rhode Islands, Production Reds were developed. Their coloring is similar to a Rhode Island but is not as consistent as they vary from dark to light. Production Reds are one of



our best producers of large brown eggs.

Rhode Island Blues

Rhode Island Blues are a hybrid crossing two of the best heritage layers, the Rhode Island Red and the Australorp. This cross results in a largely slate blue chicken with red hackle and saddle feathers. Rhode Island Blues are a medium, production bird - an excellent layer of large brown eggs.



Speckled Sussex

This rare and extremely attractive breed originated in Sussex County, England where they became widely known as prolific layers of medium sized brown eggs. When mature their plumage is a beautiful brownish red with feathers tipped in white. This variety combines beauty and utility which makes them an excellent choice for both



your backyard flock as well as a stunning show bird.

Welsummer

This Dutch breed is known for its cold hardy, calm temperament and the production of dark reddish brown eggs. Different plumage from male to female making them a unique addition to your flock.

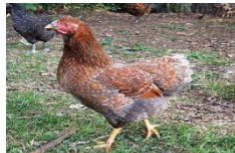
Lavender Orpingtons

Lavender Orpingtons are a solid muted, violet or blue. 'Lavender' is also known as 'self-blue' Orpingtons tend to be very friendly and have a pet-like demeanor, they are a productive layer of Medium-Large brown eggs. Lavender Orpingtons, just like any other color are large curvy birds that often go broody.



Cream Legbar

Undoubtedly the most popular auto-sexing breed to date – the Cream Legbar is not to be outdone. They are a medium-sized bird laying a good amount of medium-sized robins-egg-blue colored eggs. This curious and winsome breed's appearance varies between sexes. Roosters are a range of cream and slate barring and the hen sports a small crest. She is two-toned – largely silver with a toffee-colored breast.



Blue Laced Red Wyandotte

Their dense-deep brick red feathers are outlined by steel blue lacing. You don't have to sacrifice production with these ornamental birds. They are good layers of medium/large brown eggs while carrying a broad, muscular body. This color is particularly rare because they will not breed true. Breeding these will result in a mix of blue laced, black laced and splash chicks.



Golden Cuckoo Marans

Golden Cuckoo Marans are a fun twist on your favorite chocolate layer. They are broad, stand tall and just as their name suggests – have a golden and brown cuckoo pattern. They are fair layers of medium-large eggs ranging in color from caramel to chocolate. Golden Cuckoo Marans are an active breed that loves to forage. Chicks hatch with both lightly feathered and clean legs.



Welbar

Welbar chickens are excellent layers for anyone starting on poultry farming, specifically for egg production. These active and friendly chickens are easy to maintain, besides being hardy. If you accord the birds good care, these chickens will provide you with a steady supply of large dark brown eggs.

Broiler-Turkey Breeds



Cornish X Rock Cross
The large massive Cornish Cockerels are bred to large broiler type White Rock hens. The cross produces one of the finest quality broiler type chicks that can be found anywhere. They make market weight in 7 weeks. Many of our customers report 4 lb. broilers in 7 to 8 weeks. They give you the desired broad breast, big leg, big thigh, uniform conformation, rich yellow skin, extra fast feathering, real prime broilers.



Red Rangers

This slow-growing broiler is well-suited for more natural rearing methods, such as free-range or organic systems. Characteristics include yellow skin, Shanks, beaks along with mostly red feathering, including a small percentage of tri-color birds. Expect 4 to 5 lb birds (live weight) in 9 to 11 weeks.

Care & Brooding of Baby Chicks

Chicks should be started at 95 degrees for the first 10 days (this is extremely important) Decrease the temperature 5 degrees each week thereafter providing the outside temperature permits. The ideal temperature for 6 week old birds is 70 degrees. You will be able to tell on sight if the chicks are warm enough. If chicks are cold they will pile up; if moving around, eating & drinking they are comfortable. We recommend two 1 gallon water founts and two 4 inch feeders for every 100 chicks. Use larger feeders & founts as chicks get older.
